**Indiana Wesleyan University
Student Organization Constitution
World Christian Fellowship**

Article I: Name

The name of this organization is World Christian Fellowship. The name may be changed at any time with a co-executive decision (made by the Co-leaders). (Though the name used to be Crossway, the organization's name was changed to World Christian Fellowship to reflect the change in focus and direction.)

Article II: Purpose

World Christian Fellowship exists to engage the student body, faculty and staff in purposefully gathering together as part of the body of Christ with the intent being to fellowship together in seeking the heart of the Lord and adopting His heart in our lives. Indispensable to World Christian Fellowship are the authority and necessity of hearing and studying Scripture, the emphasis on prayer for people around the world, and outreach ministry to the lost (both in the community of Marion and around the world).

This purpose will be accomplished through:

1. Gathering together once a week for fellowship, prayer, exploration of Scripture, and worship.
2. Encouraging interest in and support for national and international missions.
3. Providing the student body with opportunities for outreach in local, national, and international settings.
4. Developing, planning, and overseeing Missions Festival week each year.
5. Partnering with other outreach groups or organization in assisting the student body to serve the Lord and expand his kingdom worldwide.

Article III: Membership

Members shall consist of students, faculty, staff, and disciples of Christ who attend the regular meetings or desire to aid World Christian Fellowship in furthering God's kingdom on earth. Any individual interested who desires to collaborate with World Christian Fellowship may do so.

Article IV: Officers

Section A: Council

The council shall be chosen by the two Co-leaders who will have been chosen by the consensus of the previous year's Co-leaders and the Faculty Advisor. The cabinet shall consist of personnel selected by the Co-leaders who demonstrate leadership qualities and hearts for service. The Co-leaders shall determine the number of council members and their respective positions; fewer than ten council members is suggested. Council membership could include such positions as Prayer Coordinator, Worship Leader, Secretary, Publicity, Outreach Coordinator, Speaker Coordinator, etc.

A council member must meet the following qualifications:

1. Have a heart to serve the Lord, a commitment to making the Lord known in all the earth, and leadership qualities.
2. Be registered as a student at Indiana Wesleyan University.
3. Not be on probation of any form with the University.
4. Have a minimum G.P.A. of 2.5.

The council for World Christian Fellowship will have full powers for determining the direction and structure of the organization.

Members of the council are responsible to:

1. Meet once a week to plan and organize the weekly meeting.
2. Develop and oversee the IWU student chapel service for the International Day of Prayer.
3. Contact and coordinate missions' representatives and keynote speaker(s) to participate in the Missions Festival week.
4. Organize, plan, and oversee the implementation of Missions Festival.
5. Encourage and support outreach opportunities within Marion and around the world.

Section B: Faculty Advisor

The Faculty Advisor shall be a full-time faculty member who displays interest in World Christian Fellowship and in reaching the lost with the message of Jesus Christ. The Faculty Advisor shall be chosen by the council and should be above reproach in all areas of life and ministry. This advisor shall meet as needed with the Co-leaders and is expected to attend weekly Thursday night meetings when possible.

Article V: Meetings

World Christian Fellowship shall be responsible for a meeting once a week to be held in a consistent location at a consistent time. The focus of the meeting shall be on seeking God and seeking to adopt His heart for the world as our own. Inherent to the meetings is the special importance of fellowship, prayer, praise, and Scripture.

Article VI: Organization Agreement

This organization agrees to abide by the policies and responsibilities for student organization as outlined by IWU. Furthermore, this organization agrees to adhere to all Indiana Wesleyan University standards, and to serve as a redemptive force for Biblical truth in activities and interactions.

Article VII: Amendments

This constitution may be amended at any time by the consensus of the council.
